ATKINSON — Road Agent Edward Stewart is expected to pin down a date for a driveway in the Hemlock Heights neighborhood to be removed from the fire lane when he meets with selectmen tonight.

v. Consentino said. Short, sweet and to the point.

In other business, selectmen will also hold a public hearing on a plan to withdraw \$300 from a police donation account to buy a refrigerator. The public hearing is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in Town Hall.

The board will as well take up issues about hiring a police lieutenant.

The agenda also includes a discussion of a special Town Meeting planned at the request of the library trustees to fix a problem that tied up money for the new Kimball Library.

The idea for the meeting was to give selectmen control of the account. However, there was controversy when the Friends of the Library offered a petition to change the purpose of the special meeting to put the library trustees, and not selectmen, in charge of the money.

Consentino warned Elaine Woodbury, the chairwoman of the library trustees, not to allow any group to bring a similar petition forward. If the trustees signaled they favored this petition tactic, Consentino said selectmen would try to defeat them at the special meeting.
